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Shopping centers

GUM (pronounced ['gum], an abbreviation of Russian: **Г**л**á**в**н**ый **у**нивер**с**á**л**ь**н**ый **м**агá**з**ин, *tr. Glávnyj Universálnyj Magazin* literally "main universal store") With the façade extending for 242 m. along the eastern side of Red Square, the Upper Trading Rows (GUM) were built between 1890 and 1893 by Alexander Pomerantsev (responsible for architecture) and Vladimir Shukhov (responsible for engineering). The trapezoidal building features a combination of elements of Russian medieval architecture and a steel framework and glass roof, a similar style to the great 19th-century railway stations of London. William Craft Brumfield described the GUM building as "a tribute both to Shukhov's design and to the technical proficiency of Russian architecture toward the end of the 19th century".

The glass-roofed design made the building unique at the time of construction. The roof, the diameter of which is 14 m., looks light, but it is a firm construction made of more than 50,000 metal pods (about 819 short tons (743 t), capable of supporting snowfall accumulation. Illumination is provided by huge arched skylights of iron and glass, each weighing some 820 short tons (740 t) and containing in excess of 20,000 panes of glass. The facade is divided into several horizontal tiers, lined with red Finnish granite, Tarusa marble, and limestone. Each arcade is on three levels, linked by walkways of reinforced concrete.

TsUM — Central Universal Department Store is one of the most renowned high enddepartment stores in Moscow.

In 1857 merchants Andrew Muir (1817–1899) and Archibald Mirrieles (1797–1877), who had arrived in St. Petersburg separately, founded "Muir and Mirrieles" Trade Company. Archibald Mirrieles was resident in St. Petersburg from 1822. In 1843 he established his own company, one of the most significant Anglo-Russian merchant houses.

In the 1880s the company transferred from St. Petersburg to Moscow and acquired a building for their haberdashery shop in Theatre Square. Their new building was erected there in 1908 in the Gothic Revival style with some modern elements. The project was designed by the famous Russian architect Roman Klein.

The store is in a six-story historical Gothic Revival style building on Petrovka Street at Theatre Square (Teatralnaya Square) in the Tverskoy District of central Moscow. The TsUM interiors have been refurbished many times, most recently in 2007.

Museums

The State Darwin Museum

DESCRIPTION

The State Darwin Museum was established in 1907 by Alexander Kots, one of the first lecturers on Darwinism to work in Moscow. At that time it was the only museum of evolution in the world. A specific feature of the Darwin Museum is that all its many exhibits are united in their one purpose: presenting a complete scientific picture of the evolution of the living world. There is a large display showing the variety of wildlife on earth, with animals from all climatic zones from the North Pole to the South. In another gallery you can follow the development of biology as a science from ancient times to the present. A large part of the collection is devoted to the question of the origin of Man, as well as the evolution of behaviour, the relationship between Man and Nature and of course its future.

Visit one of the most extensive and valuable collections of natural history in Russia!

THE BASEL'S CATHERDRAL

DESCRIPTION

The original building, known as *Trinity Church* and later *Trinity Cathedral*, contained eight side churches arranged around the ninth, central church of Intercession the tenth church was erected in 1588 over the grave of venerated local saint Vasily (Basil). In the 16th and 17th centuries, the church, perceived as the earthly symbol of the Heavenly City as happens to all churches in Byzantine Christianity, was popularly known as the Jerusalem and served as an allegory of the Jerusalem Temple in the annual Palm Sunday parade attended by the Patriarch of Moscow and the tsar.

MUSEUM OF THE PATRIOTIC WAR OF 1812

DESCRIPTION

Situated between Teatralnaya station and the entrance to the Kremlin, is an interesting museum dedicated to the war of 1812, fought between the Napoleon's army and Russia. The very first exhibits contain artefacts and interactive maps, describing the early stages of the war. Some noteworthy items include the many swords, pistols and clothing owned by both the Russian and French generals. It is also possible to see original letters written by Napoleon, specifying his plan for the invasion of Russia. MUSEUM OF THE GREAT PATRIOTIC WAR, MOSCOW

DESCRIPTION

The Museum of the Great Patriotic War is a history museum located in Moscow at Poklonnaya Gora. The building was designed by architect Anatoly Polyansky. Work on the museum began on March 3, 1986, and the museum was opened to the public on May 9, 1995. The museum features exhibits and memorials concerning World War II, known in Russia as "The Great Patriotic War". The museum features 14,143 square meters of exhibit space for permanent collections and an additional 5,500 square meters for temporary exhibits. Near the entry to the museum is the Hall of Commanders, which features a decorative "Sword and Shield of Victory" and bronze busts of recipients of the Order of Victory, the highest military honor awarded by the Soviet Union.

THE TRETYAKOV GALLERY ON KRYMSKY VAL

DESCRIPTION

The All-Union Museum Association of the Tretyakov Gallery was established in 1986 (it was renamed the All-Russia Association in 1994). The Gallery's building on Krymsky Val houses the only permanent exhibition of 20th century Russian art in the country.

It displays works by Russian avant-garde masters from the 1900s-1920s who are famous all over the world, such as K.Malevich, V.Kandinsky, M.Chagall, P.Filonov and L.Popova.

These works were followed later by Socialist Realism during the 1930s-1950s. The works by artists of the "Severe Style" from the 1960s are demonstrated in parallel with "underground" art, which started the "second wave" of Russian avant-garde.

The museum complex on Lavrushinsky Pereulok includes the Engineering Building. The building's name, built during the Gallery's latest reconstruction, is taken from the engineering maintenance services which maintain the museum's running (climate, security). It also has a conference hall for scientific conferences and symposiums. The second and the third floor of the Engineering Building are due to hold regular exhibitions of classic and contemporary art by Russian and foreign artists. In recent years it housed exhibitions entitled Peter I and Moscow, The Amazons of Avant-Garde, The Holy Land in Russian Art, etc. Its exhibitions are temporary.

NOTE FOR TOURS

1. When visiting the museum collective tour price is calculated based on the cost of tickets for excursions and entrance fees, according to the price list. Tickets are to be paid on the day, visit the museum box office . Tickets acquires senior group out of the line-up.
2. The main document, which gives the right to visit the museum, serves as a ticket, which is a form of strict accountability.
3. The basic document for the tour service is a ticket for a tour service, which is a form of strict accountability.
4. The maximum number of tourists in the group of 15 people and one accompanying (for school groups), which takes place in the museum free of charge.
5. In the case of excursions to the number of persons:
 - o less than the level paid full ticket price for travel services;
 - o more than a set level, to be paid on the total price of the ticket and excursion service is acquired on excursions ticket for each additional tripper (depending on selected excursions), and the group should not exceed 20 persons;
 - o more than 20 people to purchase additional ticket to travel services.
6. For the amateur photo and video in the museum visitor is obliged to purchase a ticket.
7. Sightseers should arrive 15 minutes prior to the tour. Senior group must register at the reception.
8. In the case of non-arrival or late arrival of the excursion participants by more than 30 (thirty) minutes, the service is canceled by the Museum tour participants unilaterally, the service is completed, a refund is not made. In case of delay the tour participants less than a 30-minute tour passes under the reduced program.
9. Accompanying should familiarize tourists with the Rules receiving tour groups in the Museum of Astronautics, placed on the museum's website.
