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OVERVIEW OF MOSCOW



Transport in Moscow

For newcomers, getting around this vast and dynamic city may seem complicated, but don't worry — Moscow's transport system is extensive, efficient, and student-friendly.

METRO:

The Moscow Metro is the fastest way to travel. With beautifully designed stations and frequent train services, it connects nearly every corner of the city. Students can get discounts on metro cards like the "Troika", which can be recharged and used for buses, trams, and suburban trains. The metro operates from 5:30 AM to 1:00 AM, convenient for both early classes and late study sessions.

BUSES AND TRAMS:

Moscow has an extensive network of buses and trams covering areas beyond the metro lines, perfect for trips to campus or neighborhood walks. Keep your "Troika" card handy for easy transfers between transport modes.

TAXIS AND RIDE-SHARING:

Apps like Yandex.Taxi are popular and affordable door-to-door options, especially late at night or when carrying heavy luggage.

BIKING AND WALKING:

Many parts of Moscow are bike-friendly, with bike-sharing programs and dedicated lanes. Walking is a great way to discover the charm of the city, especially in central areas around the universities.



To make your daily travel around Moscow easier and more carefree, be sure to download the "Moscow Metro" and "Yandex.Metro" apps. These applications provide up-to-date metro maps, route planners, information about travel times, and ticket prices—all available in English!

Leisure activities in Moscow

The Bolshoy Theatre



1, Teatralnaya Square
(Teatralnaya)

They say that you can never freely buy tickets for performances there. While this is not quite true, it is indeed difficult to get into the Bolshoy, especially to see a ballet. In 2011, the theatre was reopened after many years of being on reconstruction and not only does the Bolshoy have now an outstanding company but it also has new buildings and unique technical infrastructure. Well, even if you did not make it to a performance there, you can still go on an excursion to see the renowned classicism building, with a chariot on its frontispiece designed by Alberto Cavos.



The Pushkin museum



12, Volkhonka street
(Kropotkinskaya)

Unlike the Tretyakov Gallery, the Pushkin Museum was intended as a Western museum demonstrating the world art. The intention indeed materialised, as its collection includes Cranach and Botticelli, Rembrandt and Poussin. However, the main pearl of the museum is its collection of French impressionists and post-impressionists, including the Red Vineyard near Arles by van Gogh and the Blue Dancers by Dega. And, by all means, there is the Girl on the Ball by Picasso. Many visitors come here specifically to see it, just like the Mona Lisa in the Louvre.



The Tretyakov Gallery



10, Lavrushinsky Pereulok
(Tretyakovskaya)

Together with the Russian Museum in Saint Petersburg, this is the main collection of national art. The collection of Pavel Tretyakov, who was a merchant and gifted the collection to Moscow, is packed with masterpieces: from the main Russian icon of all times – the Trinity by Andrey Rublev, to the works of Repin, Vereschagin, Surikov, Vrubel and Serov. Apart from its static exhibition, the Tretyakov Gallery always has interesting temporary exhibitions.



The Gorky Park



9, Krymsky Val Street
(Park Kultury)

The park became the most popular open space in Moscow only a couple of years ago after it was largely reconstructed. They removed tasteless amusements, wisely rearranged the park layout, provided free Wi-Fi and opened quality and cheap fast food outlets here. The Garage Museum is also here, which is the main exhibition space of modern art. One more thing: in the Gorky Park, you not only may but also encouraged to lie down on the grass.



Student documents



Student ID

Student ID is a document that verifies your enrollment at the university. You can pick your student ID at the International Student Services. Student ID is given out on the first year of study and you need to extend it validity at the beginning of each year of study. You can extend your student ID at the International Student Services. Student ID duplicate can be given to a student in the event of its loss or damage. You will need to fill out an application and submit it along with a photo (3x4 format) to the International Student Services. After you have finished your studies you will need to hand in your Student ID to the International Student Services and it will be stored in your individual record file.



E-pass

- Allows you access to all MISIS buildings.
- Only issued upon presenting your student ID or a notification from your Student Office.
- Confirms student status for receiving remaining documents and student benefits.

Freshmen's issuance of student cards and passes to enter university buildings and dormitories takes place at the Student Office as a part of the "Immersion" adaptation program. After the issuance of the "Admission to the University" order, an invitation to receive a set of documents is sent to the email address provided in the enrollment application. To visit the Student Office, it is necessary to undergo a pre-registration procedure. This is to ensure that the document collection process is organized as comfortably as possible and without long queues. To enter the University, it is mandatory to have an identity document!

Muscovite card (Social Card for Public Transport in Moscow)

- Available for all full-time undergraduate and doctoral students.
- Discounts on public transport in the City of Moscow and suburban train services.
- May be used as a bank card for cashless purchases of goods and services.
- Provides discounts for certain stores and pharmacies in Moscow.



Issuance of Scholarship Bank Cards

NUST MISIS, in collaboration with Gazprombank, issues bank scholarship cards. After the issuance of the admission order for budgetary education, a Gazprombank campus bank card of the "MIR" payment system will be issued for a student. The account will be activated only after student signs an application and provides the following documents (for foreign citizens or non-residents):

- Original and a copy of the identity document (passport).
- Notarized translation of the identity document (passport) into Russian and its copy.
- Migration card original with a valid period (if available) and/or other documents issued by the Ministry of Internal Affairs on migration matters — residence permit, temporary residence permit.
- TIN number — a foreign taxpayer identification number. It is important for students to know their TIN in advance before visiting the Student Office to apply for a bank account.

Bank account activation is carried out within 5-10 days by Gazprombank employees only after students provide the above listed set of documents and sign the applications.

Personal account

The MISIS student account brings together all the main electronic services for students.



At any time, you can

- Check the schedule.
- Access free Wi-Fi and cloud storage.
- Order a certificate.
- Check your grades in the electronic gradebook.
- View your portfolio of achievements.
- Contact the university administration with any questions.
- Pay for university tuition and dorm accommodation.*
- Apply for social support.
- Find or return a lost item through the lost property office.
- Find current job openings, internships, and internships.

Pay attention!

To activate your account, you'll need to enter your personal file number. You can get this number at the Student Services Office when you pick up your student ID card. Your student ID card number is the same as your personal file number.

Personal safety

How to act in extreme situations?



Suspicious objects = possible explosive devices

If you find suspicious items, immediately inform the administration or the guard corps. Do not touch, open or move them. Be sure to wait for the arrival of the Operations team. Before your arrival, you are the person responsible for the possible consequences.



Evacuation

If you have received information about the evacuation from the hostel management or law enforcement, remain calm and clearly follow their orders. If you are in the room at the time of evacuation, take the documents and money, turn off the electrical appliances, turn off the water, be sure to lock the entrance door with a lock.



Where to report a crime?

If you become aware of a crime that is being prepared or committed, immediately inform the territorial authorities of the FSB, the Ministry of Internal Affairs or the administration of the campus.



Rules of conduct if you are a hostage:

- Don't look criminals in the eye, don't act defiant.
- Do not contradict criminals, if necessary, comply with their demands, do not risk the lives of others and your own.
- Avoid tantrums and panic.
- Do not perform arbitrary actions (sit down, get up, go to the toilet), ask for permission.
- Do not move if you are injured, this will reduce blood loss.

Safety in Moscow



If you experience an emergency, you can call Russia's emergency number 112 (free of charge):

- Works everywhere in Russia.
- Accessible from cellular phone even without SIM cards.
- English speaking dispatchers are available.

General recommendations and advice

- Always keep the original versions of documents confirming your legal stay in Russia on your person, e.g., passport, migration card, registration, fingerprint certification, medical insurance policy.
- Keep copies of all of your official documents.
- Regard procedures to check your documents and belongings on the part of the police with understanding; always be polite.
- While crossing the street, make sure you use designated walkways and illuminated areas.
- Confirm with your insurance company, where you can receive medical treatment.
- Only consume food and beverages that you are certain about; treat unknown products with caution.
- Do not drink water directly from the tap; please boil or filter your water, or use a bottled water delivery service.
- Always bear in mind climate conditions; dress appropriately.



Safety in Moscow

How to stay safe from scammers

Did the “rector”, “vice-rector”, “deputy minister”, or “FSB officer” call you? Don’t believe it — these are scammers! Malefactors use messengers, social networks, and AI tools to generate voices or even videos in order to impersonate officials and demand money transfers.



Stay vigilant and pay attention to the following suspicious signs:

- Someone claiming to be from the university’s leadership, an embassy, or any state representative with whom you do not normally communicate contacts you via messenger.
- Large sums of money are mentioned urgently, with a request to transfer funds to an unfamiliar account.
- The interlocutor requests that you keep the conversation confidential.



What to do if scammers call you?

- Do not transfer money to strangers.
- Immediately report the call to your supervisor.
- If The Federal Security Service (FSB) officers or other law enforcement officers are mentioned during the conversation or in messages, inform the vice-rector for security or the rector’s office.
- Block the suspicious account and phone number.

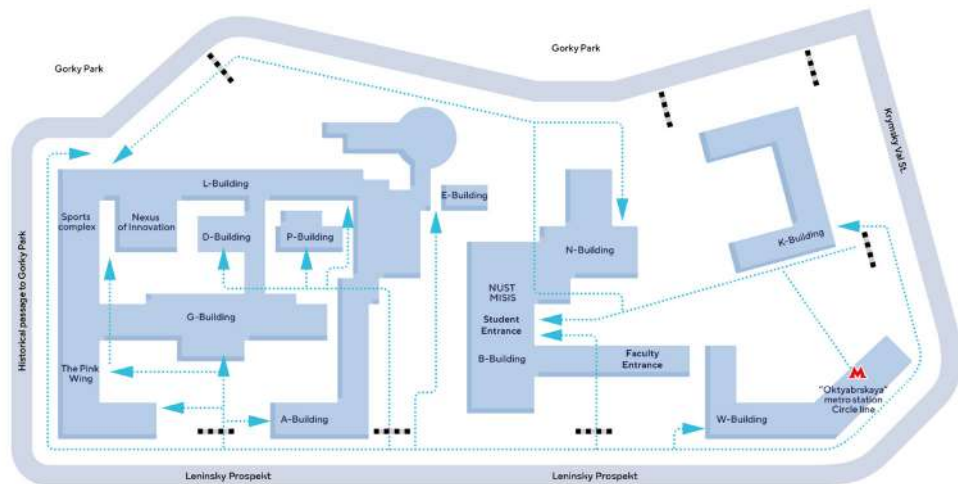

MISIS University buildings scheme

MISIS University is located at the Oktyabrskaya metro station on the Circle Line (brown). It takes 1 to 4 minutes to walk to the university, depending on which building you need to go to.

The university has several buildings close to each other. To make it easier, each building has a letter name. For example, the building on Krymsky Val is called the “K-Building” Most of the buildings are connected by internal passages.

The classroom name includes the building, floor, and room number.
For example, “K-210” means the class is in the “K-Building” on the second floor.

EDUCATION



Student Office

You can always contact us with questions regarding academic performance, conditions for participation in competitions for receiving increased and personal scholarships, registration of a scholarship bank card, educational contracts, etc.

The Student Office (StO) is always ready to consult you on issues of settling in and living in a dormitory, social benefits, transfer from paid education to education at the expense of budgetary allocations, the work of the psychological support service "Tochka Opory", and tell you about other opportunities provided by our university. Here you can also get certificates, extracts and other documents ordered in your personal account, find out about the possibility of transferring to another educational program, arrange an academic leave, and if you are a foreign student - register with the migration service. From the first day of enrollment, StO will help you get a bank card, a student ID card and a pass. Follow the mailing list in your corporate email!

Academic year and certification

At NUST MISIS, the academic year is divided into two semesters: fall (September-January) and spring (February-June). There are three types of classes: lectures, practical classes and labs. All of them involve active participation and homework.

Also, be prepared for the fact that you will have group and individual projects, tests, independent and control work. For your work and projects, you will receive points according to the point-rating system (PRS).

Points are converted into grades on a five-point scale, where "5" is excellent, and "2" is unsatisfactory, which means that you have an academic debt that you can eliminate at the beginning of the next semester.

Important!

If the course ends with a credit, the final grade is made up of the points earned during the semester. If the course ends with an exam, the points earned in the exam are added to the points for the semester. Thus, if you want to see the "excellent" in your grade book, be active throughout the semester, and not only at the exam.



Grading system:

- Excellent
- Good
- Satisfactory
- Unsatisfactory

Each semester ends with a session: first, students receive "credits" and then take exams. Credits can be undifferentiated (without a grade) or differentiated (with a grade). Exams always include a grade. The certification format depends on the specific subject.

Academic mobility

MISIS University cooperates with more than 50 international research and educational organizations, providing opportunities for you to study or intern abroad.

Academic mobility is an opportunity to study for a short period at a partner university (from 2 weeks to 6 months). Take part in internships, summer and winter schools at foreign universities on the chosen topic.

In the 2025-2026 academic year, more than 100 of our students took part in academic mobility programs in China. We are actively working to ensure that our students have more opportunities to gain the necessary international experience and intercultural communication skills.

To international student

If you are an international student, you should contact the University's Student Office (for international students from non-CIS countries who arrived to study under a visa-required procedure) or the dormitory passport office (for international students from neighboring countries who arrived to study under a visa-free procedure) for questions regarding migration registration and registration.

To register, you will need the following documents:

- Passport and copies of each completed passport page.
- Migration card and a copy of the migration card.
- Previous registration (if applicable).
- Notarized translation of your passport into Russian.
- Copy of your rental agreement.

Library

To master the curriculum, you will definitely need books. There are two options: get a paper copy from the library, or get an electronic copy in the MISIS Electronic Library. All you need is to do is select the necessary section and find a book or manual, or simply use the search bar.

You are automatically registered in the library upon admission, so to visit it you only need to have a pass or student card. Immediately after enrolment at the university, you have access to all electronic resources and library services.

You can reserve books from home and access your personal reader account, electronic databases, news, and other information on the library website.

DORM MOVE-IN

Dormitory rules



Required:

- Keep your room and common areas clean and tidy, and treat furniture and equipment with care.
- Pay your dorm rent on time.
- Conserve electricity.
- Strictly adhere to fire safety regulations.



Prohibited:

- Bringing, storing, and drinking alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
- Bringing and storing all types of firearms, traumatic weapons, airguns, and bladed weapons, explosives, and hazardous chemicals.
- Smoking in the dormitory building and on its territory.
- Consuming and distributing narcotics.
- Allowing strangers to stay in rooms or handing over room keys to strangers.
- Violating fire safety regulations.
- Making noise after 11:00 PM.

Violation of fire safety regulations by dormitory residents is grounds for termination of the lease agreement and eviction from the dormitory.

Dormitory accommodation

If you're an out-of-town or international student, you'll be assigned to a dorm with all the necessary facilities for studying and comfortable living: free internet, a study room, a gym, laundry facilities, and a cafeteria. All dorm buildings are located no more than in 20-minute from the university.

The move-in period starts at the end of August. If your move-in date is changed, you will be notified in advance. Before moving in, please make sure you're on the move-in list, published on our website.

International Students will need the following documents:

- The original identity document (passport) and its copy.
- Notarized translation of the identity document (passport) into Russian and its copy.
- The original migration card and its copy.
- A copy of the Obligatory Medical Insurance (OMI) or Voluntary Health Insurance (VHI).
- A medical certificate issued by licensed State institutions subordinate to the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation, indicating the absence of contraindications for living in a dormitory, including a mandatory note about undergoing fluorography and the absence of infectious diseases (tuberculosis, HIV, hepatitis B), and a vaccination certificate.

Accommodation costs depend on the square footage of the premises, the average cost of utilities, and whether you are studying on a free or paid education basis. Current prices can be found on our website.

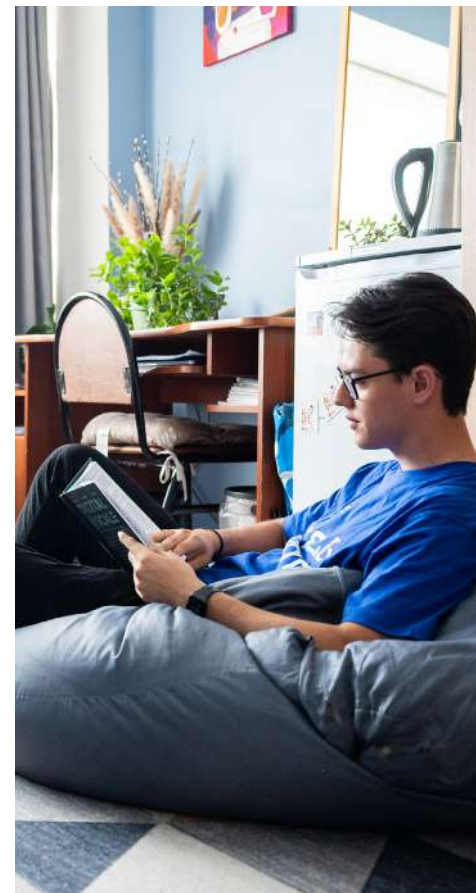

Residence registration

Temporary registration at the dormitory is mandatory for all residents, except for students from the Moscow region. This document will allow you to receive benefits and discounts, as well as free medical services provided on a regional basis. The dormitory passport office will handle your temporary registration. Be sure to confirm the address with the administrator and contact them within a few days after moving in.

Adaptation of students in the dormitory

Dormitory Student Council
